Highlights

Meeting of March 11th

Chairman: Chairman Jim Danner requested an update from the Organ Committee. Phase 1, the arrival of the organ, has been completed. Phase 2, installation of the speakers, is being planned. A beam, to match the architecture of the other cross-beams in the Sanctuary, will be placed in the Narthex to hold most of the speakers. Phase 3 will occur later on, and includes installation of two additional speakers in the front of the Sanctuary for an antiphonal sound.

Treasurer's Report: Margaret McCloskey reviewed the written report. As of February 28, 2018, income over expenses was – 478.82. (A brief financial statement is found elsewhere in this newsletter. Members may view a detailed financial report by contacting the Treasurer or the Church Office.)

Financial Secretary: Judi Jopling reviewed the written report. The weekly average of offerings for February was \$2,293.34. In addition, one memorial was received for Gift of Hope.

Elders: Johnny Schuknecht reported that the Board will be requesting the congregation consider offering weekly communion, rather than the First, Third, & Fifth Sunday Communion, at the April Voters Assembly.

Trustees: Bill Jopling reported on the workday of March 17. A water leak was repaired. The Board will seek to have the mowing done by a contractor who bags the grass.

Evangelism: It was reported that Santiago Carrillo, Blasa Dozal, Ray Fear, and Chrissy Fear have volunteered to serve as members of this board.
