Highlights

Meeting of May 7th

Chairman: Jim Danner requested an update on Old Business Items. Ethel Martin has stated that Lifetouch will be here June 3 & 4 to take pictures for the Picture Directory. Johnny Schuknecht reported on the sound system purchase and installation, which has come in under budget.

Treasurer's Report: Margaret McCloskey reviewed the written report. Income over expenses at the end of April was -\$11,194.70. It was noted that some of the evangelism monies designated for missions have been paid for the entire year, which contributed to the larger deficit. Financial Secretary: Judi Jopling reviewed the written report. The weekly average of offerings for April was \$2,111.81, which included some Lent offerings.

Trustees: Doug Weir reported on ongoing maintenance around the facilities. It was hoped the kitchen remodeling would be completed soon.
