Highlights

Meeting of March 3rd

Chairman: Jim Danner reported on information/bids for cleaning the steeple, and the Council agreed to pursue having the steeple power-washed. It was reported that the ice machine needed maintenance, and the congregation would discuss the possibility of selling it. With budgeted monies available for the purchase of an AED, the Council agreed to pursue obtaining this life-saving device.

Treasurer's Report: Margaret McCloskey reviewed the written report. Income over expenses as of March 31, 2019 was +28,213.33. A recently invested CD will mature in 2020. Four CDs will mature throughout 2021. (A brief financial report is located elsewhere in this newsletter. Members may view a detailed financial report by contacting the Treasurer or the Church Office.)

Financial Secretary: La Nell Felps reviewed the written report. The weekly average for offerings during the month of March was \$2,450.45. (Our weekly needs are: \$2,720.96).

Elders: Pending approval from the Voters Assembly, the old offering plates will be donated to a mission congregation in Johnson City. Once the supply has ended, the use of non-alcoholic wine will be discontinued.

Trustees: A light has been installed for the parking lot, and additional lighting may be pursued in the Fall. The issue with the Fellowship Hall foundation is still being addressed.

Evangelism: Doug Weir reported that the Board now has available Visitor/Welcome Packets for first-time visitors and those new to the neighborhood. Members are asked to keep any eye out for new neighbors and then take a "welcome packet" to them. Easter books for little children were planned to be distributed on Easter Sunday.

Stewardship: No report.

Human Care: The Board is planning to purchase gifts for Mothers Day and Fathers Day.

Fellowship: Marla Cappella reported on the Lent meals held prior to each Lent Vespers service and the Easter Breakfast.

Christian Education: Ethel Martin reported that Mt. Olive was planning to have an earlier VBS this year, and the Board would be discussing the possibility of having VBS here at Divine Savior again this year.

Gift of Hope: Information was shared on the main event being held on Saturday, April 27, at the Church, and the Golf Tournament being held in Hondo on Saturday, June 22. Karlee Riser and Bryleigh Shullanberger are this year's beneficiaries.

Pastor: Pastor Wehmeyer reviewed his written report which included Family Care, Official Acts, and the latest Church Statistics. The Voters Assembly was scheduled to discuss the possibility of an upcoming Church Anniversary for the year 2020.
